

Judges' Ranking Sheet

After double checking math on each of the judge's score sheets, have judges place the ranks on their own score sheet (in the "Rank" spot). (Highest score gets a "1" second a "2" and so on). If a judge has a TIE on his or her sheet, they will have a tie for rank. They MUST break their tie in score before writing down ranks. **THERE CANNOT BE TIES ON ANY JUDGES SHEET FOR THE RANKING PROCESS TO WORK!** Then, record the ranks from each judge's score sheet in the corresponding area below. Add up the total rank. The **LOWEST RANK** then is first, the second lowest second, and so on (*this is the opposite of how to place the ranks on the score sheets as mentioned above) If there are no "tied" ranks, you have your finalists (or you are done, if there is no breakout room). If there is a tie in total rank, see the tie breaker sheet.
